

Appraisal District Profile:

Appraisal Districts were created as a central location for appraisal information and services. They are considered political subdivisions of the state, whose organization and responsibilities are defined in the Texas Property Tax Code. Appraisal Districts are funded by the entities they serve, pro-rata according to the tax levy, as outlined in §6.06 (d) of the Texas Tax Code. Since the year 2000, the Guadalupe Appraisal District has returned as 3rd quarter allocation credits \$707,573 to the taxing units served, according to §6.06 (j) of the Texas Tax Code.

The Guadalupe Appraisal District provides appraisal services to 22 taxing units. The boundary of the Guadalupe Appraisal District follows the same boundary as that of Guadalupe County. Currently, the Guadalupe Appraisal District appraises approximately 84,590 parcels of property.
